In 2024, the National Trust for Historic Preservation named Los Angeles's Little Tokyo neighborhood one of the nation's 11 most endangered historic places. For decades, community developers and CDFIs have been working to preserve the rich culture and history of this neighborhood, while progressing its economic development. We will meet with the community development leaders in Little Tokyo, who have achieved some of the most successful place-based community development in all of Los Angeles. This walking tour will be presented by Genesis LA — a Los Angeles County-based CDFI — and Little Tokyo Service Center who remains an instrumental CDC in Little Tokyo and beyond.
